

When Arthur was about 2 years old the Ayers family moved from Black Diamond to Issaquah. Once as a young boy the Issaquah towns people dressed Arthur in a soldiers suit, bandaged his leg as tho he were a wounded soldier and carried him in a parade up and down the street, ending the celebration by throwing a likeness of Kaiser Wilhelm II into the bonfire.

Survivors include his wife Louella, daughter Judy & her family and his sister Ruth Ayers Hofto. Arthur became a lifetime member of the Black Diamond Historical Society in 2001 (Ruth is also a lifetime member of the Black Diamond Historical Society).

**Paul Maine Botts,** a Lifetime Member, was

#### **CEMETERY PROJECT OVERVIEW**

The Black Diamond Historical Society, with the support of 4Culture has now completed "The Black Diamond Historic Cemetery Grave Stone Photographic Documentation Project".

The Black Diamond Cemetery is listed on the State and National Registers of Historic Places. Volunteers of the Black Diamond Historical Society felt there was a need to preserve the cemetery gravestones of Black Diamond's Historic Cemetery as a photographic record. With the financial support of 4Culture of King County, the task was undertaken.

The existing database was obtained from the City, and after a close review, it was determined that there were some inaccuracies and missing information. To link the photos with the existing database proved to be quite a challenge.

As the project evolved, much of the database was corrected and amended when the information could be verified. There are still some questions that need to be answered, but some may be lost in the past forever.

Thanks to the hard work of some of the volunteers of the Black Diamond Historical Society, all of the cemetery gravestones have now been photographed. The records of information are continuing to improve, even after the conclusion of the initial project.

It is our wish to have this list available to the public, and we welcome any feedback to help to improve the accuracy of these records. For those who may not be able to visit the Cemetery in person and wish to have a photograph of a gravestone, contact the Black Diamond Historical Society and a photo will be mailed to you for a small processing fee.

This Black Diamond Band in uniform appeared on the cover page of The Pacific Coast Bulletin of March 11, 1926. They had recently been heard over the radio. The 'Bulletin' states: "Not only does the Black Diamond Band appeal to the ear with its melodies and martial airs, but the boys present a striking appearance in their natty new uniforms as well. They are an attractively garbed organization. Frank Carroll, director of the band, is a musician of years of experience and organizer of the famed Bellingham Elks' Band."

In a scrapbook album donated by Helen Strom Manowski, we located a *Renton News* news clipping dated June 1948 with a large write up and this picture with all the names of the musicians.
